Helpful Household Hints From The Dog

Toilet Cleaning Instructions:

- 1. Put both lids of the toilet up and add 1/8 cup pet shampoo to the water.
- 2. Pick up the cat and soothe him while you carry him towards the bathroom.
- 3. In one smooth movement, put the cat in the toilet and close both lids. (You may need to stand on the lid.)
- 4. The cat will self-agitate and make ample suds. Never mind the noises that come from the toilet the cat is actually enjoying this.
- 5. Flush the toilet three to four times. This provides a 'power-wash and rinse'.
- 6. Have someone open the front door of your home. Be sure that there are no people between the bathroom and the front door.

Home-Brewing Can Be Dangerous For Dogs

Home-brewing is a trend that is becoming more and more popular. Sadly, this increase is also increasing the occurrence of hops toxicity in dogs. Hops are the plant used in the process of brewing beer, and both the 'raw' or spent hops are toxic. True flowers or dried hops plugs tend to be more toxic than hops pellets, while wild hops have been found to be non-toxic. The diagnosis is generally made based on history of having home-brewing supplies as well as seeing hops in vomit.

Clinical signs of toxicity can include agitation, panting, excitement, flatulence, rapid heart rate followed by life-threatening elevations in body temperature. Death has been reported in as little as 6 hours without appropriate treatment. Rectal temperatures can reach to greater than 108 F, and these temperatures can be very difficult to control. The high end of normal of a dog's temperature is 102.5 F, and any temperature above 106 F can lead to an "unwinding" of the body's proteins as well as permanent brain injury.

Treatment consists of aggressive decontamination measures including induction of vomiting, gastric lavage ("washing out" the stomach under anesthesia), administration of charcoal, and enemas. Active cooling by any means available is extremely important. There are also specific medications that can be given in the hospital to help control the clinical signs.

Prognosis for survival is generally guarded to poor, and unfortunately, many deaths have been reported. Any breed of dog may be affected, but breeds that are predisposed to malignant hyperthermia (extreme elevation of body temperature for an unknown reason) tend to be more susceptible.

An Obituary: The Legend Of Mr. Dillon



The Samoyed Club of America awarded him 2 working titles. His many therapy hours, sheep herding and back packing counted as points toward his WS and WSX. He earned his last title (THD- Therapy Dog Title) in October of 2011. This was so appropriate. Above and beyond all this, he was a gentle, well-mannered, kind, even tempered, confident, loving boy. He will be terribly missed.

He was the son of CH Chifluff's Blues Legend (father-Mac) and CH Sandbeck's Radiance (mother-Rainy). He was the eldest of 4. He was a Mac a Rainy puppy.

He is survived by his niece (Abby), his adopted brother and very special friend (Gabby), the people who were privileged to call him their own (Linda A. and Donaven Murray), his breeders and beloved friends (Gayle and Stuart) and many wonderful four legged and two legged friends.
